Number of places

Approximately 100 students will be
admitted each year across all three of
the degree programmes. There is no
set target for any one programme and
all applicants are judged on the same
basis. If you are interested in more
than one of the three programmes, it
is only necessary to apply for one. It
is possible in the first year to move
between the degree programmes if
your interests have changed.
