

Subject Specific Information (2007-08)

Archaeology:

Modules taught over two terms modules can only be entered at the start of the first term.

Economics and Management:

- If you are an EU student, you can only study Economics and / or Management modules if you are on a dedicated exchange with the School of Business. Non EU students are permitted to apply, but acceptance will depend on space availability. School of Business students can study for the autumn term only, but not for the spring term only.
- Students studying for the autumn term will normally accumulate 4 ECTS, but if you require 5, you will have to complete extra assessed work as decided by the academic tutor.
- If students do not take the final examination then the ECTS value is reduced. Students cannot accumulate 10 ECTS in the School of Business without taking the examination.

Education:

Only EU students on a dedicated Education exchange are permitted to study modules in the Institute of Education.

English:

- Students not on a dedicated exchange programme with the English department are only allowed to study a maximum of 20 ECTS credits.
- Students cannot study modules for less than the full 10 ECTS credits.
- Students taking Part One modules must be here for two terms (autumn and spring).
- Students must apply for autumn and spring term modules by 1st June 2008.
- Spring term starters must also make their module selection before the 1st June 2008. Any student applying after this date cannot be guaranteed modules in the School of English and American Literature.

Film, Theatre and Television:

Erasmus students not on a dedicated exchange programme with the department of 'Film, Theatre and Television' are not permitted to select modules. Non Erasmus students interested in studying in the department of 'Film, Theatre and Television' should email studyabroad@rdg.ac.uk in the first instance.

Fine Art:

- Fine Art applicants must submit with their application a selection of your most recent work (approximately 15 images) on a CD, DVD or slides. Please ensure that you write your name clearly on the disk / slide, but also indicate the media, date and approximate size.

- Please try to avoid repetition (life drawings, prints etc) and where possible try to include a range of work i.e. 2D and 3D.

History:

Students cannot study the 'Skills' component of a module (valued at 5 ECTS) unless they study the 'Period' component also (valued at 10 ECTS).

Languages / I.W.L.P.:

- Students are only permitted to study one IWLP module.
- Students who are studying at Reading for all three terms and who elect to take Language based modules (I.W.L.P., Classics or School of Modern Languages) must take the examination in the summer term.

Law:

- The School of Law can only accept EU students if they are on a dedicated Law exchange programme.
- It is unable to admit any new students to modules in the spring term.
- Students who study two term modules for the autumn term only must consult with the school coordinator on arrival, however you will only be able to achieve 5 ECTS maximum.

Philosophy:

You can only choose Part 3 Philosophy modules if you have studied Philosophy previously.
