EMERGENCY LAWS (TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS)

Food (Labelling)

THE LABELLING OF FOOD (GENERAL LICENCE) ORDER, 1947.

DATED JUNE 25, 1947.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation 2 of the Defence (Sale of Food) Regulations, 1943(a), as having effect by virtue of the Emergency Laws (Transitional Provisions) Act, 1946(b), and of all other powers him enabling the Minister of Food hereby makes the following Order:—

1. Pursuant to Article 17 of the Labelling of Food Order, 1946, as amended(c), the Minister of Food hereby authorises that, during the continuance of this Order, beer brewed in the United Kingdom shall be exempt from Article 2 and Article 3 of the said Labelling of Food Order, 1946 (which Articles relate respectively to the labelling of pre-packed food on retail sale and on sale otherwise than by retail).

2. This Order shall cease to have effect—

(a) as respects the sale by retail or display for sale by retail of such beer, on the 1st day of January, 1949; and

(b) as respects the delivery of such beer pursuant to a sale otherwise than by retail—

(i) on the 1st day of July, 1948, where delivery is pursuant to a sale by a packer or labeller thereof; and

(ii) on the 1st day of October, 1948, where delivery is pursuant to any other sale.

3. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1947, and may be cited as the Labelling of Food (General Licence) Order, 1947.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order permits for a limited period the sale of beer brewed in the United Kingdom free from the labelling requirements of the Labelling of Food Order, 1946.
