# EMERGENCY LAWS (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS)

### FOOD (LABELLING)

## The Labelling of Food (General Licence) Order, 1947 (Amendment) Order, 1948

Made	24th June, 1948
Laid before Parliament	29th June, 1948
Coming into Operation	1st July, 1948

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation 2 of the Defence (Sale of Food) Regulations, 1943(a), as having effect by virtue of the Emergency Laws (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1947(b), and of all other powers him enabling, the Minister of Food hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. The Labelling of Food (General Licence) Order, 1947(c), shall be amended by substituting for Article 2 thereof the following Article:
  - "2. This Order shall cease to have effect-
    - (a) as respects the sale by retail or display for sale by retail of such beer, on the 1st day of January, 1950; and
    - (b) as respects the delivery of such beer pursuant to a sale otherwise than by retail—
      - (i) on the 1st day of July, 1949, where delivery is pursuant to a sale by a packer or labeller thereof; and
      - (ii) on the 1st day of October, 1949, where delivery is pursuant to any other sale.".
- 2. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1948, and may be cited as the Labelling of Food (General Licence) Order, 1947 (Amendment) Order, 1948.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The Order extends the period during which beer brewed in the United Kingdom may be sold free from the labelling requirements of the Labelling of Food Order, 1946.
