FOOD (LABELLING)

The Labelling of Food (Amendment) Order, 1952

Made - - - - 17th March, 1952 Laid before Parliament 18th March, 1952 Coming into Operation 31st March, 1952

The Minister of Food, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation 2 of the Defence (Sale of Food) Regulations, 1943(a), as continued in force by the Emergency Laws (Continuance) Order, 1951(b), and of all other powers him enabling in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 31st day of March, 1952, and may be cited as the Labelling of Food (Amendment) Order, 1952.
- 2. The Labelling of Food Order, 1950, as amended(c), shall be further amended by deleting from entry number 8 in Table A of the First Schedule thereto the words "Christmas puddings" where they appear in column 1 and the words "Provided that as regards Christmas Puddings this exemption shall cease on such date as the Minister may by order appoint" where they appear in column 3.
- 3. The Labelling of Food (Amendment) Order, 1951(d), is hereby revoked but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention of the Labelling of Food Order, 1950, as amended thereby.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This amending Order provides that from 31st March, 1952, Christmas puddings shall cease to be exempt from the requirements of the Labelling of Food Order, 1950, which require the ingredients to be specified on the label.
