Doug King wants to change the construction industry paradigm. Working on a corporate level to provide businesses with low impact, sustainable building consultation, King is "Ranked amongst the most influential figures in UK sustainable construction." He has been awarded Fellowships of the Royal Academy of Engineering and the RIBA and has numerous other awards for design. He is probably best known however, for his "persistent denouncement of EcoBling used to disguise poorly designed buildings". He is a firm believer that "Individually, we may not be able to change the world, but we can develop the tools which will allow the world to change." Having had thirty years in his field it is claimed that there is no problem that he can't solve and this is clear through the sheer variety of projects he has worked on, from historic sites and listed buildings to factories and superstores.
