**Why choose
this module?**

Think you might be interested in UK teacher training?

Passionate about your degree subject and want to work on outreach to schools?

Interested in developing a range of transferable skills to increase your employability?

this may be the module for you.**

The objective of this module is to allow University of Reading undergraduates the opportunity to observe creative teaching and learning, gain relevant understanding of how a UK state secondary school operates, and share their own degree knowledge with school pupils. Progress is framed by the development of transferable skills.

**When and what
will you study?**

After training seminars in the summer term (usually after exams have finished), you will go into a local secondary school with a partner in June/July to observe how the curriculum is creatively delivered and to identify what helps students to learn.

In the autumn term, you will develop your skills in collaboration, reflection and communication as you plan and deliver a teaching session in groups (drawing on your subject expertise) to school children. Finally you will prepare a poster to summarise your experiences and present this to your peers and tutors.



How to apply

- By application form and by interview.
- Successful applicants must successfully complete an enhanced DBS check.
- Places are limited and priority will be given to applicants with experience working with young people, plus the relevant attributes listed in the table opposite.
- Applications are open until the end of spring term.
