THE PROGRAMME

Royal Berkshire NHS Foundation Trust (RBFT) have formed a unique partnership with the University of Reading's Institute of Education (IoE) to offer a Postgraduate Certificate in Healthcare Education (PGCert HE).

This is a one year programme with three modules, offered in collaboration with the IoE at the University of Reading and experienced Healthcare Educators. The course is also accredited by the Academy of Medical Educators (AoME).



Who is it for?

The programme is aimed at staff from across the Berkshire, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Integrated Care Service and includes allied health professionals, nurses, and doctors who have a teaching role and/or responsibility for the training, development and/or appraisal of other healthcare professionals. This includes those with primary and secondary care responsibilities in the healthcare profession. A distinctive feature of this programme is its diversity, attracting applicants from the Medical, Nursing and Allied Health Professional groups.

We aim to promote fairness and equality in selection for this programme and are particularly keen to encourage applications and participation from staff from Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) backgrounds.

Who is eligible?

- You need to have a degree or postgraduate qualification or extensive and relevant experience in education.

What's expected of me?

It will take one year, part-time to complete the course in three modules.

Each module has a time commitment of 200 hours and is made up of face-to-face teaching (3 days per module); independent study, including wider reading (independent and directed); preparation tasks for the taught days; completion of formative assessment task; summative assignment preparation and reflection. Each week students will be given tasks they are expected to complete. Attendance at the taught days is compulsory.

In essence there is a high workload of self-directed study. Please be sure you can commit to the expectations of the study and attend all the taught days before applying.

For local applicants of the Royal Berkshire Hospital Foundation Trust, you are expected to remain in the Trust for the duration of the course, to be a permanent employee and not to be within your probation period.

How much does it cost?

The cost of the programme is £3,600.

For employees of the Royal Berkshire Hospital, central funding may be available to support costs in a limited number of cases where individual departments are unable to. Enquiries should be directed to Jo Sandy for non medical staff and Andrew Jacques for medical staff.
