# Managing the menopause at work

A guide for employees and their managers



In this **guide**, colleagues affected by menopause will be referred to collectively as women, although the guidance is intended to be inclusive and applicable to anyone experiencing the menopause and/or menopausal symptoms, including intersex, non-binary and transgender people.

We also recognise that people from different ethnic backgrounds and disabilities can experience different challenges and barriers. We have, therefore, sought views from colleagues in other EDI (equality, diversity and inclusion) staff networks to help shape this quidance.

This guidance is one tool that can create more positive outcomes for women who are experiencing symptoms that can impact on their working lives.

### Sex Discrimination Training

If you're treated unfairly because you're a man or a woman, this is sex discrimination. It applies to men and women of any age equally and so it includes girls and boys. Sex discrimination can also be referred to as sexism.



## Votes for Women:

Where do women sit in politics today?

13:00-14:00 101 Carrington To celebrate Women's History Month, the Women's Staff Network is hosting a lively and enlightening talk with Dr Jacqui Turner, Associate Professor of Modern British Political History, on women's position in British politics both past and present and discussing why women should, and need, to vote in the next election.

Dr. Turner was a senior partner with the UK Parliament's Vote100 project which celebrated the 1918 centenary of some women being granted the right to vote. She was the national curator of Astor100, the centenary celebration of the first women to enter parliament. She is an acknowledged expert on Nancy Astor, the first woman to take her seat in in the House of Commons, whose extensive papers are held here at the University of Reading.
