Funding that may be available to you:

- Reading Bursary
 for undergraduate students with
 a household income below £27,000
 to assist with living costs. Provides
 a cash award or tuition fee waiver
 of £1,100 per year.
- Pre-entry Travel Bursary for applicants invited to an offer holder or visit day to cover travel up to £300.
- Placement Bursary

 a cash bursary for a placement
 or study abroad year to support
 living costs, travel or childcare
 of between £200-£1,000.

Funding that may be available to you:

- Care Leavers Bursary £1,000 for each academic year of your course for UK undergraduates who meet our definition of care experienced:
 - A student who has spent time in local authority care or had experience of the care system:
 - is registered on a full-time undergraduate course
 - is classed as a 'home' fee paying student
 - is under 25 years of age at the start of their course
 - is studying their first degree
- Pre-entry Travel Bursary

for applicants invited to an offer holder or visit day to cover travel up to £300
