Our Mission, Our Difference

EmployAbility is the leading force for a truly disability-inclusive workplace. Unapologetic in the drive for a level playing field, we support, advise and advocate on behalf of talented neurodiverse and disabled university students to help you build the career you deserve.

We are the only organisation providing free, direct support to neurodiverse and disabled students in terms of individualised adjustments advice and advocacy. We also run internships, graduate and first year programmes with our disability-inclusive partners.

We have supported more than 13,000 students into employment. We would like to do the same for you.

Your Rights, Your Choice, Your Privacy

You should not be made to feel that you are inauthentic or dishonest if you are not open about your disability. You are entitled to privacy and have the right to exercise choice. Our stance is reflected in the Equality Act 2010, which prohibits an employer from asking any questions about disability or health during the recruitment process. They can only ask you about the adjustments required to level the playing field. And, there is no need for you to disclose the underlying disability.

Advocacy & Adjustments

Based on what you tell us about how you are impacted in daily life, we provide detailed, personalised advice about adjustments at each stage of the recruitment process and in the workplace. We then advocate on your behalf for those adjustments to any employer, irrespective of whether we have an existing relationship with them. We do not tell the employer about your disability.

We also run specific workshops to empower students to confidently ask for the adjustments they need.
