

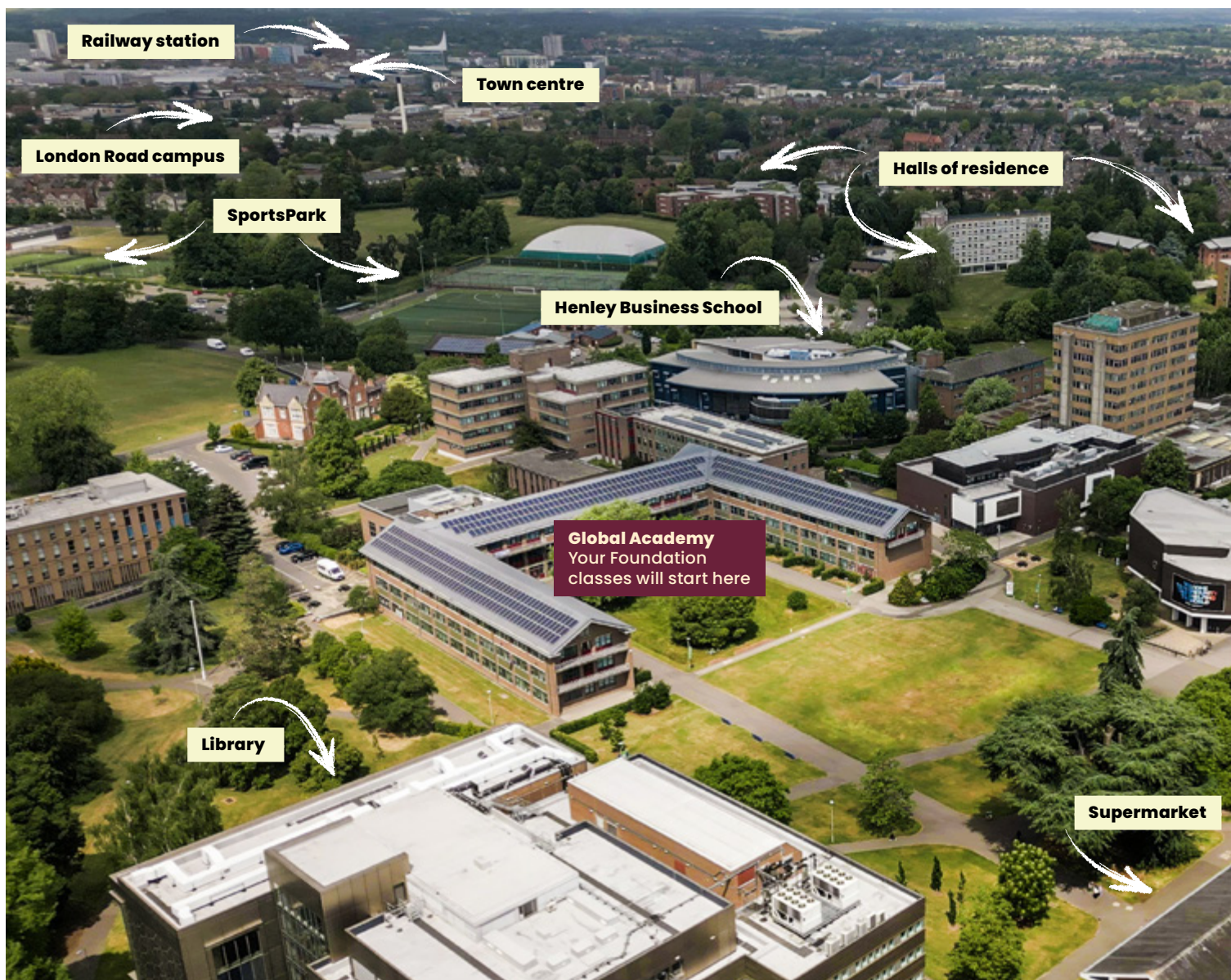

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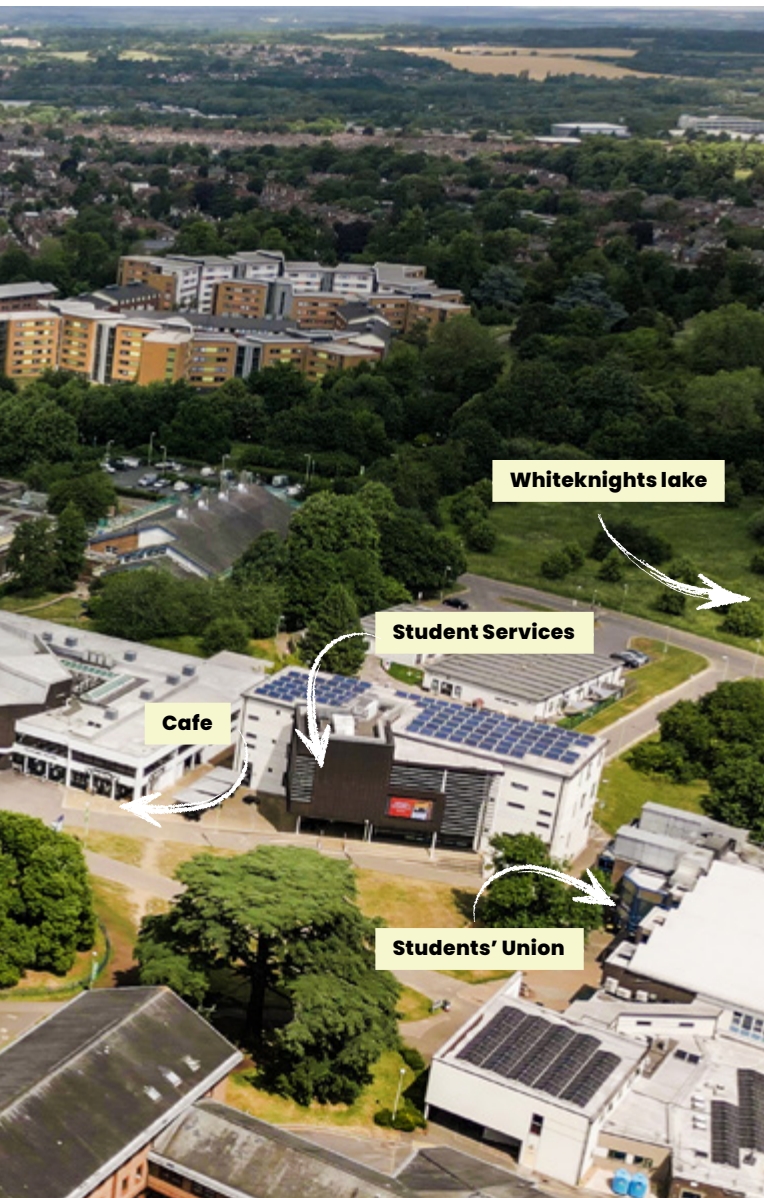
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Your university journey starts here

The foundation year, done properly

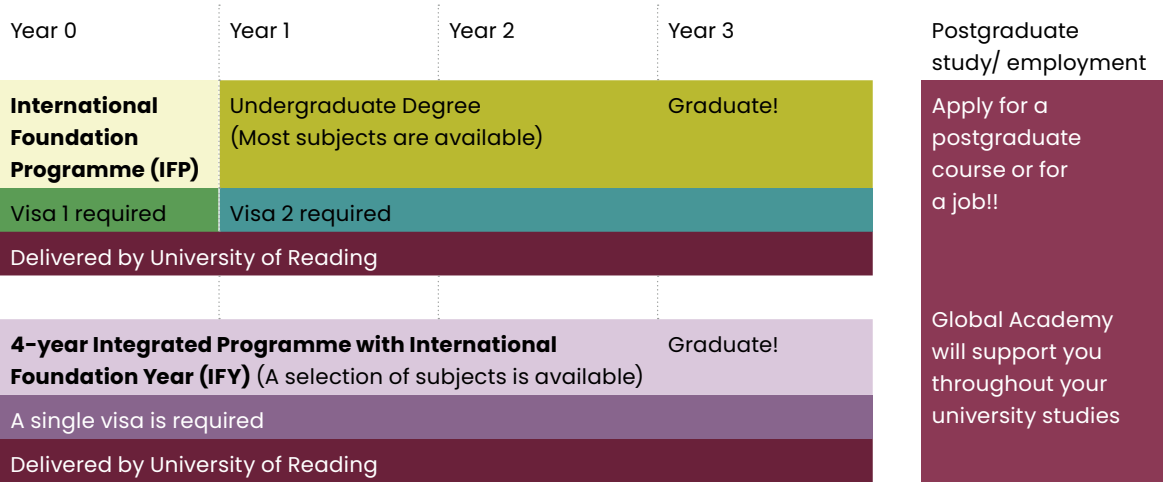
At the University of Reading, you have the choice to study the 1-year International Foundation Programme (IFP) or a wide range of 4-year degrees with integrated International Foundation Year (IFY). (See pages 10–11 for possible International Foundation Year (IFY) courses).

The International Foundation prepares you for undergraduate study in three ways:

- you will receive academic training in subject specific modules for your undergraduate degree
- you will acquire the transferable academic skills needed for undergraduate studies and beyond
- you will develop your academic English language abilities.

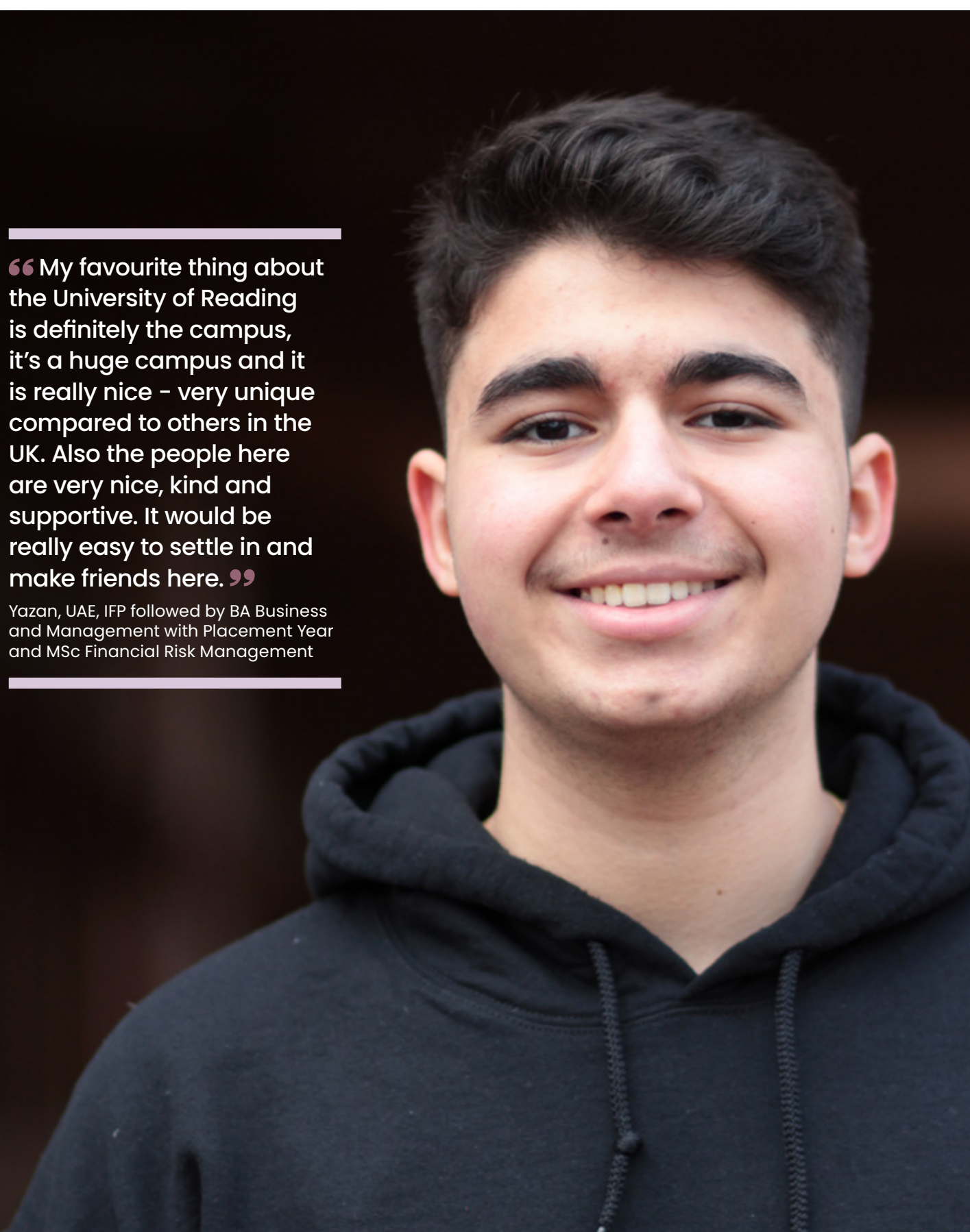
You can choose one of two entry points – September or January – both options provide the same quality and benefits. Students wishing to progress onto a science degree, life science, art and design, and some education degrees will be able to join the September entry only.

International Foundation Programme (IFP)

Our International Foundation Programme (IFP) is a one-year foundation course for international students and is our 1+3-year Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) option.

Our IFP September programme enables you to progress to over 200 undergraduate degrees at the University of Reading. These include Henley Business School courses, and courses in humanities, biological sciences, arts and communication design, and law.

Our IFP January programme, enables you to progress to business, management, finance and most social sciences degrees. Please check our website for details of the Social Sciences progression degrees available.

International Foundation Year (IFY) 4-year Integrated Programme

If you have already decided on the subject you wish to study, an alternative to the IFP is a 4-year undergraduate degree with an integrated International Foundation Year (year 0). These 4-year programmes enable you to apply for a single visa to cover the full 4 years of study.

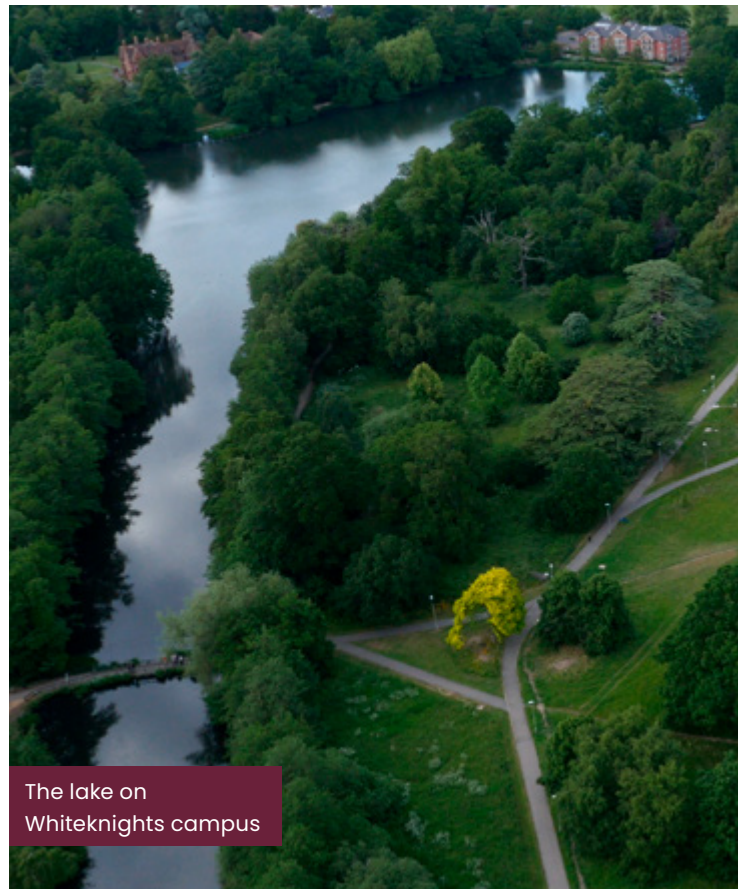

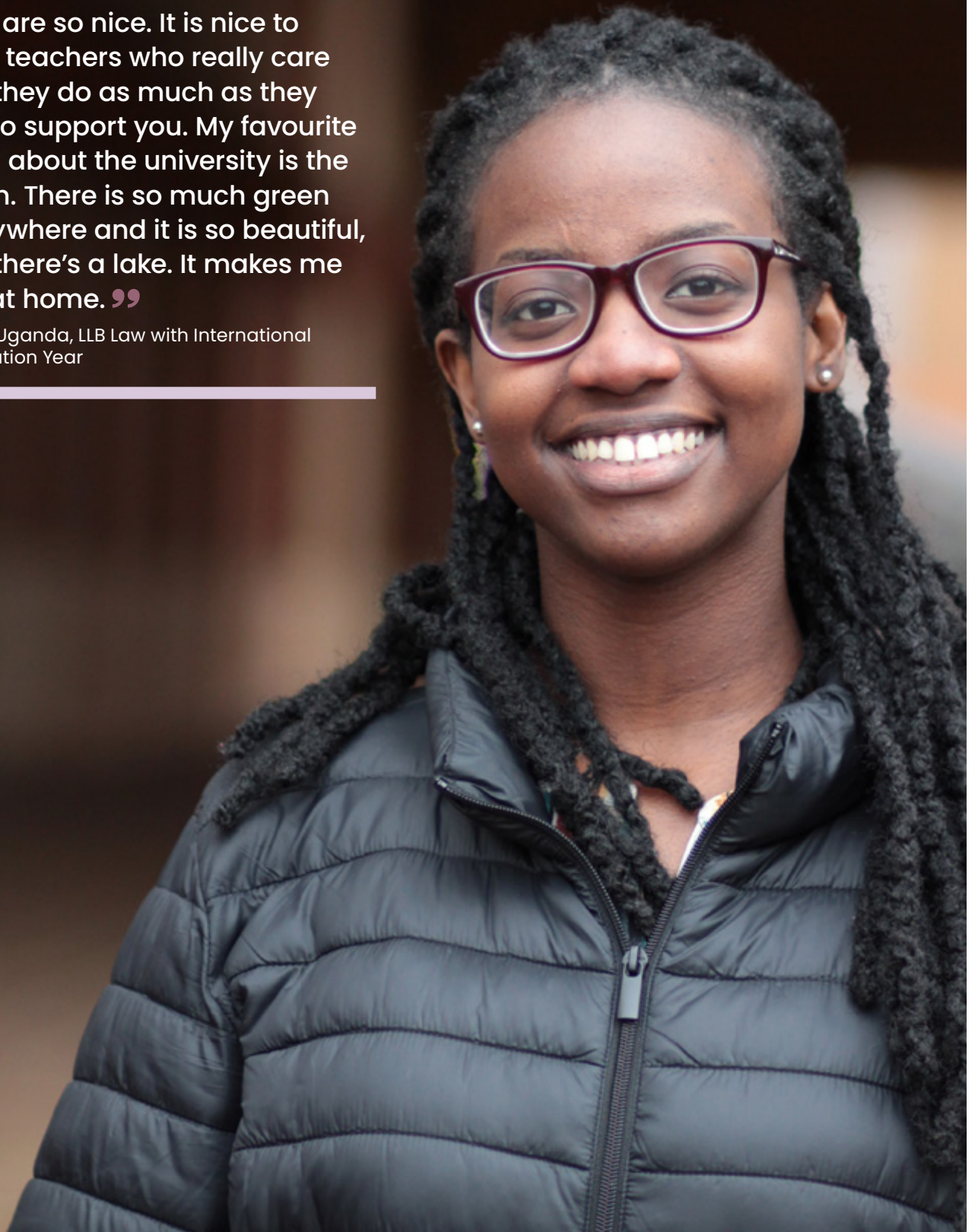

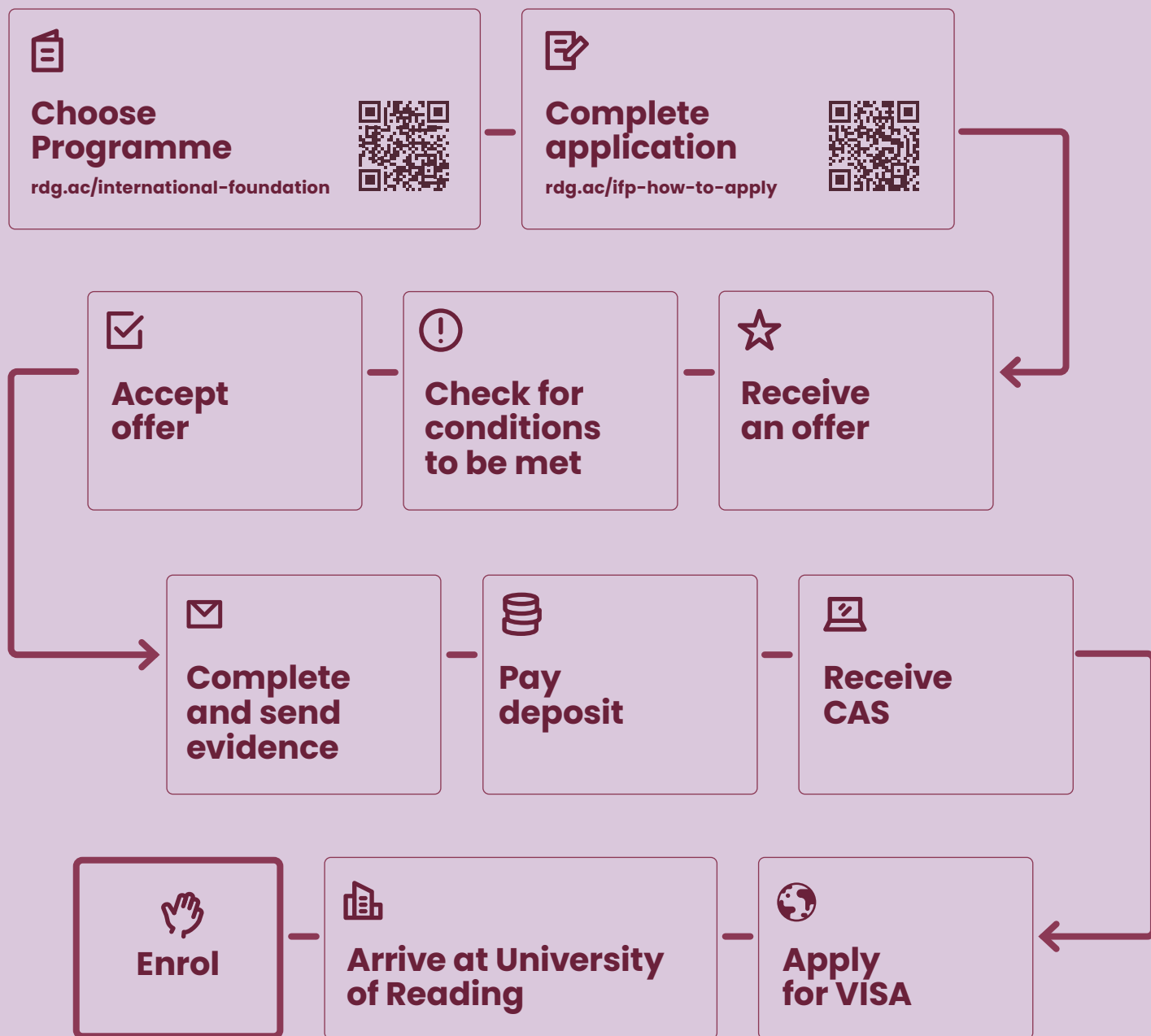

Scholarships

Excellence Scholarship

A select number of Excellence Scholarships will be awarded to International Foundation offer holders that show strong academic merit. For 2026/27 entry, the scholarship is £5,000.

To apply for funding, you must have received an IFP/IFY offer of admission for entry in the academic year 2026/27. After successful completion of your international foundation year and having achieved strong grades, you will be eligible to apply for the UG Excellence Scholarship, which is £5,000 per year.

Academic Entry Requirements

IB Diploma: 24 points overall.

IB Certificate: at least 5 in all Standard Level subjects.

IGCSE: 5 passes at grades A*-C in relevant subjects.

AS and A Level: 72 UCAS tariff points or above.
