

The University of Reading Pre-Sessional English (PSE) Programme

Depending on your IELTS or equivalent level at entry, **you can take up to 39 weeks of Pre-sessional English study, with summative exit assessments either in December** (postgraduate students only) **or September** (both postgraduate and undergraduate students).
