You can further boost your career prospects by combining your modern language studies with English Literature or English Language.

Our joint courses allow you to study both subjects in detail, adding to the breadth of your knowledge base and equipping you with skills from two different disciplines.

COURSE OPTIONS:

BA MODERN LANGUAGES AND ENGLISH LITERATURE

Studying English Literature will enable you to examine in greater detail authors and genres from tragedy to Gothic, from Shakespeare and Dickens to Plath and Beckett. We will also introduce you to other areas like children's literature, publishing studies and the history of the book. The breadth of module options across language, culture and literature is a great way to complement your study of foreign language and culture. English literature can be combined with any of our core languages. Example modules include:

- The business of books
- Writing America
- Black British fiction

BA MODERN LANGUAGES AND ENGLISH LANGUAGE

In your English language studies, you will analyse language, its use in different social settings, and how it is acquired and used by children and adults. You will develop your knowledge of grammar and phonetics in order to become a highly skilled user and analyst of the English language. English language can be combined with any of our core languages. Example modules include:

- English language and society
- Globalization and language
- Language and the new media

HISTORY CLASSICAL STUDIES

JOINT PROGRAMMES



Maximise your time at university and boost your career prospects by combining your modern language studies with History or for Italian you could also combine this with Classical Studies. Our joint courses allow you to study both subjects in detail, adding to the breadth of your knowledge base and equipping you with skills from two different disciplines. You will also gain valuable time management skills in balancing your studies.

Through our courses you will become confident and highly skilled in written and spoken language. You will master the fundamental elements of the language, to the point where you will graduate with a near-native command of it and our joint degrees allow you to combine this with valuable knowledge and skills from across a range of other subjects.

COURSE OPTIONS:

BA MODERN LANGUAGES AND HISTORY

You will explore people and politics and we will teach you the skills you need to study and research history. The breadth of module options explore history from across the world which is a great way to complement your study of a linguistic and cultural area. History can be combined with any of our core languages. Example modules include:

- Rebel girls: the influence of radical women 1792–1919
- Belief and Unbelief in Europe: Religion, Science and the Supernatural c.1400–1800
- The brightest jewel in the British crown': The Making of Modern South Asia, 1757–1947

BA ITALIAN AND CLASSICAL STUDIES

Combine the study of modern Italian culture and the Italian language with that of Ancient Rome and Greece in this stimulating joint honours degree. Through this course you will become confident and highly skilled in written and spoken Italian and this is complemented by developing an understanding of the most important features of the culture and history of Italy. Example modules include:

- Roman History: the rise and fall of the Republic
- Ancient drama
- 'Race' in the Ancient Greek and Roman Worlds

ECONOMICS INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

JOINT PROGRAMMES

Our joint courses allow you to study both subjects in detail, adding to the breadth of your knowledge base and equipping you with skills from two different disciplines.

Through our courses you will become confident and highly skilled in written and spoken language to the point where you will graduate with a near-native command of it.

COURSE OPTIONS:

BA MODERN LANGUAGES AND ECONOMICS

Develop your knowledge of written and spoken language while exploring culture and learning key economic analysis skills that will aid you in your future career. These courses provide you with the opportunity to explore the culture, history, film, literature and politics of your chosen linguistic area, whilst studying practical economic issues and exploring the relationship between economics and society more widely. You will focus on how economic tools can be applied to different markets and situations. Your degree will help you to understand the levers of policy and provide policy advice in response to Economics problems. Economics can be combined with any of our core languages. Example modules include:

- Economics of social policy
- Development economics
- International economics

BA MODERN LANGUAGES AND INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

Develop a deeper understanding of the world in which we live through the study of international relations combined with your chosen language. You will learn the language in the political, social and cultural contexts of the countries in which it is spoken and will acquire a strong grounding in fundamental elements such as political ideas, international relations and strategic studies. You will have the opportunity to study a wide range of specialist core and optional modules, which cover topical issues such as International Terrorism, the Far Right and Feminism and Political Theory. The course also delivers innovative modules in which you can take part in United Nations and Middle East simulations and gain an insight into the political process. International Relations can be combined with any of our core languages. Example modules include:

- Introduction to contemporary democracy
- The media and politics
- War, peace and international ethics

DISCOVER A UNIQUE COMBINATION

The study of international development has never been more important: complex global problems affect our lives; many parts of the globe are experiencing rapid change; and the richest nations have made commitments to halve world poverty. A joint Honours degree that combines a modern language (French or Spanish) and International Development can give you an insight into fascinating societies, cultures and histories around the world. This programme provides an interdisciplinary grounding in core development issues, drawing on our century-long reputation in the study of agriculture and rural development, in conjunction with in-depth study of a modern language and the diverse cultures associated with it. The degree programme provides a fantastic starting point for careers in international development, or wider opportunities, where a combination of near-native level language skills, inter-cultural awareness and training in the natural and social sciences gives a competitive advantage.

This 4-year programme includes the opportunity to:

Spend Year 3 combining studying abroad and work placements relevant to your growing interests and expertise (NGOs, schools, environmental organisations, etc.), supported by staff with country-specific expertise

Start your language study at Beginner's, Intermediate or Advanced level. By the end of your degree, you will have achieved near-native fluency in your chosen language of study.

Achieve a profound understanding of different cultures and their development needs and aspirations
